A Joyful Community Day!





Mother Elzata Goodman, who for years has done the "planning and leg work" for our annual event, goes far above and beyond what I had realized for the success of the event. Even though our church is a "second home" for her, as she is a member of the St. John Baptist Church of

Camden, NJ (where she is a member of two choirs and works with the School of Christian Discipleship, the singles ministry, the Potter's House Ministry, and Women's Fellowship), she works tirelessly for our annual Community Day. I had always known that Mother Goodman begins contacting area companies, agencies, churches, community



leaders and politicians months in advance. Many show up asking for her, as she has been their persistent and tenacious point of contact for years. Homefront Fundraiser

Ujima's members have always been helping to better their communities from outside as well as within the church. In following the trend, a special collective initiative, taken on through a school project was put forth to help those in need. From June 3rd to June 10th, Ujima collected donations and offerings to a Central Jersey organization, Homefront. The charity's goal is to end the cycle of poverty by providing housing, food, clothing, and training to underprivileged families.

Originally, this idea of service began in my Spanish class as an assigned project to learn more about local charities as a part of 'El Mes de Servicio' (The Month of Service). In addition to creating a video diary, the teacher, Sra. Snyder, encouraged students who were genuinely interested to contribute to the organizations they learned so much about. After contacting Pastor and hearing their enthusiastic response the project took on new life. In addition to the money raised by Ría Gurram, a classmate at West Windsor-Plainsboro High School North the total amount donated was \$150. The experience of fully engaging with the community was truly inspiring. As I continue on with civil service my work will only be made that much more through the support of the church.

Leadership Workshop

The "Our Best For Our King" leadership workshop was held on May 7, 2017. Pastor Norwood gathered those in leadership of various ministries of the church and those who were interested in developing a more faithful and growing congregation together to discern the guidance of the Holy Spirit on such matters. The following report is taken from the notes of First Lady Tanya Norwood:

To improve the worship life of the church, worship leaders need to fast and pray together in order to prepare themselves and intercede on behalf of others who are coming to worship. This could be done during the week preceding their designated Sunday. The youth ushers should meet with the senior ushers a few times a year for training and coordination purposes. Both usher boards should served together on each fifth Sunday. There was a desire for the redevelopment of the youth choir and youth dance ministry. It was suggested that there be an increase in designated testimonial services. It would be a blessing to not only have a prayer box but also a praise box that provides for the report of answered prayers.

Improve communication through the further development and use of the new church website, the use of "Robo-Calls," and the development of a Facebook page and texting services.

What each ministry does and what each ministry may need should be presented so the members, especially new members, can be more aware. This should be aimed at encouraging every member to be involved in some ministry in the church to ensure the support of all of the ministries of the church. There should also be a reevaluation of ministries to determine which ones are still functioning, which ones are not, and what new ones may be needed. Some that are needed include: 1) A mechanic's assistance initiative by the men's ministry for women in need of such support so that they are not taken advantage of. Create a list of mechanics and other trades persons who are reliable and willing to be accountable for their services...2)New strategies for more outreach into the surrounding community, and being unafraid to do so wherever the Lord may lead...3) Because mentoring and counseling are important, it was thought that, in addition to more workshops on such topics, the opportunity to train lay counselors and to have specific resources available to address certain critical needs and challenges, such as:

financial crises; domestic violence; marital issues; parenting issues; dealing with devastating diagnoses; grief and mourning; etc. This could be anything from handouts and flyers that provide comfort to directories for community resources to meet individual needs. The Lighthouse Café could become a resource room for such materials and for recommended books...4) Development of a prayer line, so people can call in for intercession... 99.1 Radio Station was lifted as an example of one that worked well... 5)Develop a ministry care for new marriages, new mothers, new parents, and seniors... 6)Redevelopment of a feeding ministry and renovation of the kitchen for further growth of the hospitality ministry... 7) Development of an exercise ministry.

Why did you choose Ujima as your church family?

My family and I felt welcome and very comfortable. The members were truly warm and we don't take it for granted. What impressed me most was the sound teaching; consistently high quality Word! Pastor Norwood's sermon's are in depth, provocative and they cause you to think deeply about your life positions on real issues. He is very well prepared and I like that we are continuously stretched, challenged and encouraged by the ministry of the word. Another reason I like Ujima is every time I've ever gone there, I have been blessed. Little by little, we continue to grow. I'm very grateful to be here. I'm willing to do anything I can to help but I'm honestly not sure where God would have me serve.
