about the importance of not being afraid of the police




because they really are here to help us. Bro. Ira serenaded us throughout the day and Senator Shirley Turner popped in as she has faithfully done every year.

blessed fellowship, with scripture readings, prayers, and a free continental breakfast. The annual Mother's Day "Church La-




dy" Contest was fun filled, as usual. This year, our 1st Lady - Sister Tanya Norwood, was the 1st place winner!



Wordsearch 274 and Solution


